
ABOUT THE REPORT

MESSAGE FROM THE LEADERSHIP

Last year was a landmark year for Rumo. We embarked on an intense journey to **transform Brazil's infrastructure**, promoting the expansion of railways, offering safe logistics solutions, and positively impacting the communities surrounding our network.

We have maintained a strong presence in these territories, overcoming challenges by implementing and supporting projects, forging strategic partnerships, transforming lives, and increasing our social investments, which have a positive impact not only on the Brazilian logistics sector ecosystem but also on society as a whole.

We direct our resources and energy into projects that foster, promote, and strengthen development initiatives. We create socio-productive actions, engaging schools, businesses, and communities to change the course of many stories, directly and indirectly impacting people throughout Brazil.

We have grown while maintaining our commitment to the sustainable development of the country. Our actions, guided by the Company's socio-environmental responsibility, resonate in the lives of our employees and other stakeholders, through the Environmental Education Program and Communication and Engagement initiatives, generating a positive impact on the communities surrounding our operations. In this way, we generate a virtuous cycle that encompasses all those involved.

In 2023, we continued and advanced our strategies across all our action fronts. This was achieved through significant self-funding, **amounting to over R\$3.9 million in direct investment**.

Over the years, we have carried out 40 social actions in Baixada Santista, impacting communities in the cities of Cubatão and São Vicente, with initiatives in favor of social urbanism and housing; the right to education; culture, sport and leisure; the environment and income generation to support the sustainable development of vulnerable communities in the region.

Constantly on the move, we pass through various cities, intersecting with a multitude of stories and individuals, united by shared challenges. In response, we have Instituto Rumo, where we place children and young people at the heart of our initiatives, fostering education for citizenship, through sport. Through our "Futebol de Rua" project, we had a positive impact on four cities, benefiting 400 children and adolescents, with a total investment of R\$ 660,000 in these activities.

We are committed to fostering deeper connections within our community. Thus, we make a difference through the "Trem do Bem" volunteer program, through which we invested over R\$232 thousand in social actions in 2023, positively impacting the lives of over ten thousand individuals.

We are pleased to share that in the past year we have invested approximately R\$10.8 million through incentive laws, supporting projects to encourage reading, assistance for the elderly, support for culture and sports, benefiting around 350,000 people across the country.




"Trem do Bem" impacts not only the individuals and communities directly benefited throughout the year, but also raises awareness among those who journey with us.

We are the largest independent railway logistics company in Brazil. We offer rail transportation logistics services across more than 13,500 km of railway lines and ten terminals.



COMMUNITY RELATIONS



COMMUNICATION AND ENGAGEMENT

Maintaining a good relationship and close proximity with the communities surrounding the railways is essential for the Company.

We have a structured Social Communication Program to engage communities. Through this program, we constantly conduct socio-economic and environmental diagnostics along the railway network and maintain evaluation projects to implement mitigation or compensation measures for the identified negative impacts.

Based on the findings of the diagnosis, we developed socio-environmental communication strategies tailored to the specific needs of each location, with the aim of raising awareness and engaging the community.

In addition, throughout 2023, we held meetings with community leaders to create participatory socio-environmental diagnoses.

Social Communication activities aim to establish a dialogue and build trust-based relationships with communities, as well as to promote environmental awareness, disseminate the Company's initiatives, and inform about possible changes to the railways to ensure the safety of the surrounding areas.

In this process, we can identify local leaders, as well as potential partners for socio-environmental actions in the regions, and gain a deeper understanding of the relationship between residents and the railway.



"NA MÃO CERTA" (ON THE RIGHT HAND) PROGRAM

To protect children and youth in the surrounding communities, Rumo is part of the "Na Mão Certa" **Program** (PNMC), a Childhood Brasil initiative to prevent and combat the sexual exploitation of children and adolescents on Brazilian highways.

The primary strategy adopted by the Program's signatory companies is to raise awareness among truck drivers, so that they act as agents in the protection of the rights of children and adolescents.

Throughout 2023, we implemented actions and shared with our employees and other stakeholders Rumo's engagement and commitment to combating the sexual exploitation of children and adolescents in the locations where the Company operates.


RUMO IS AWARDED AT THE ANNUAL MEETING "NA MÃO CERTA" (ON THE RIGHT HAND)

For the 4th consecutive year, Rumo supports the program, and was recognized and awarded for its engagement in actions against child sexual exploitation implemented in the territories where it operates.

RELATIONSHIP CHANNEL

We are committed to establishing transparent and ethical communication between the Company and the communities surrounding our operations.

In order to meet the demands of the communities, we have **Rumo's Relationship Channel**, for the registration of general requests, complaints, reports, and support for the community.

Information is received and analyzed by an independent, specialized company, ensuring absolute confidentiality and appropriate treatment for each situation, with reporting to Rumo's senior management.

During our communication actions, we constantly disseminate the existence of the Channel to residents in the vicinity of the railway network.

We focus our actions on communities with the goal of fostering dialogue and strengthening trust, generating a positive impact.

Our Relationship Channel drives long-term social transformation, through the identification of local needs and the search for tangible solutions.





INDIGENOUS COMMUNITIES

Rumo is committed to indigenous communities around its railways and works to ensure that the rights of these peoples are respected.

Since 2022, we have signed a Term of Commitment with the Mato Grosso State Audit Court (TCE/MT) to ensure that the construction works on the Rondonópolis-Cuiabá-Lucas do Rio Verde Railway System comply with the socio-environmental requirements related to the Boe Bororo indigenous peoples, inhabitants of the region.

The actions to be implemented to fulfill this commitment will be outlined following the completion of a Consultation Plan with the benefiting indigenous community.

In 2023, in Serra do Mar region of São Paulo, we implemented the Basic Environmental Plan for the Indigenous Component (PBA-CI) to provide for the socio-environmental compensation of the duplication of the Itirapina-Cubatão section and the renewal of the railway network. The PBA-CI covers the following villages:

- Guyrapaju;
- Tape Mirim:

- Krukutu; and
- Tekoa Mirim.

The development and implementation of the Indigenous PBA for Malha Paulista involved various areas of the Company, and works are also planned in another 12 villages.

In the initial implementation phase, access roads to the Guyrapaju village and infrastructure works such as community kitchens, sanitary modules, cultural centers, and sanitation networks were handed over to the communities. Through these initiatives, we have promoted access to healthcare, well-being, and basic sanitation for the Tekoa Mirim, Krukutu, Tape Mirim, and Itaoca villages.

A substantial part of the obligations were carried out by the indigenous peoples themselves through the transfer of financial resources, ensuring the autonomy of these communities.



CHILDREN'S DAY PARTY IN THE VILLAGE

In October 2023, Rumo and partner organizations hosted a Children's Day event, bringing joy and fun to the Piebaga village, located within the Tereza Cristina Indigenous Land, in the municipality of Santo Antônio de Leverger (MT).

The event featured activities and games for children, promoting leisure and well-being experiences for the indigenous community. The village chiefs and elders were present at the celebration, strengthening activities in favor of respect for indigenous culture and the appreciation of ancestral traditions.

The partner companies Rivoli do Brasil, Franciscon Infraestrutura e Consórcio Construtor FLRV, Prosul, and IDG, engaged in the construction of the Senador Vicente Emilio Vuolo State Railway, also supported the event.

Through initiatives like this, Rumo fosters the well-being of local communities, providing joy and respect for cultural traditions.



ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION PROGRAM (EEP)

In fulfillment of our commitment to the people and communities surrounding our railways, Rumo has established an Environmental Education Program, partnering with schools and other relevant stakeholders in the regions where we operate.

The purpose of the Program is to carry out teaching and learning activities, disseminating information on environmental and railway safety issues, in order to foster community participation in the care of the territory.

The Program is structured around the following objectives:

- Improve the "environmental values" of communities, in a participatory manner;
- Create multiplier agents to disseminate good environmental and railway safety practices in the society;
- Raise awareness among the school audience about the importance of the railway, actions to improve railway safety and the protection of the surrounding environment; and
- Raise awareness among the local population about correct waste disposal.



MALARIA CONTROL ACTION PLAN (MCAP)

In 2023, we partnered with Anhanguera University in Rondonópolis (MT) to provide training in Laboratory Analysis of Malaria and Chagas Disease. Representatives from Municipal Health Departments of cities in the region participated in the training.

The five-day training course was conducted by professionals from the Central Public Health Laboratory (LACEN) and Anhanguera University provided its clinical analysis laboratory for the classes. This is one of the actions being developed in accordance with the Malaria Control Action Plan (MCAP) of the Senador Vicente Emílio Vuolo State Railway.

In addition to the course, donations of materials and equipment were made to assist in the fight against and control of Malaria, which can also be used in the fight against diseases with a high incidence in these locations. We distributed computers, educational materials, bacteriological microscopes, entomological kits, Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and laboratory supplies.

We support the Health Departments in disseminating messages about World Malaria Day and Malaria Day in the Americas, and we make available the Malaria Control Guidelines in Brazil, prepared by the Ministry of Health, to help medical teams in cities effectively treat patients...



EXPANSION OF THE RAILWAY NETWORK

We grow to generate shared value and positive impact wherever we go.

Rumo's expansion strategy is aligned with the Company's sustainable growth, guided by our socio-environmental commitments, with respect for our employees and the communities around us.

In 2023, our Social Responsibility Program monitored expansion works, implementing social diagnosis actions and applying specific projects tailored to the realities of each territory.

SUSTAINABLE CONSTRUCTION SITE

In order to continuously improve construction sites related to expansion and modernization, we have implemented the **Sustainable Construction Site Project** in 2023.

This project is aimed at the voluntary participation of contractors, who, by joining the initiative, are subjected to monthly assessments carried out by Rumo's environmental Audit team and can be certified with the "Sustainable Construction Site" seal when they reach a minimum score of 70 points.

Throughout these audits, a comprehensive range of socio-environmental aspects are analyzed. This approach reflects our commitment to sustainable practices and environmental responsibility in all phases of our infrastructure projects.

The Sustainable Construction Site Project not only presents an innovative standard for sustainable construction management but also brings benefits to the environment and society, particularly impacting populations living in the regions and surroundings of construction sites.

SEEDLING ACTIONS

Railway expansion and Social and Environmental Responsibility following the same path

During 2023, through the Socio-environmental Responsibility actions of the Mato Grosso State Railway Project that will reach the municipality of Lucas do Rio Verde (LRV), Rumo carried out a series of actions in municipalities of the state of Mato Grosso to encourage good environmental practices.

Furthermore, we engaged the communities in these territories in the preservation of natural resources, enhancing the mitigation of impacts on the Company's environmental management. These activities included:

- Collective seed planting actions;
- Awareness-raising talks in gardens about the importance of forest preservation;
- Donations and plantings of native Cerrado seedlings in schools and communities in the region;
- Socio-environmental actions to donate tree seedlings to indigenous territories; and
- Donation of supplies for the installation of nurseries.

The action aimed to foster the reforestation and flora enhancement project in the Ribeirão Quilombo permanent preservation area in Americana, SP.

The event was attended by the city's mayor, Chico Sardelli, and deputy mayor, Odir Demarchi, as well as employees from Rumo and the municipality itself.

A CLOSER LOOK AT BAIXADA SANTISTA

In response to the challenging scenario faced in early 2023, we intensified our social initiatives in the communities surrounding our operations in Cubatão and São Vicente, in the Baixada Santista region of São Paulo.

Aligned with current public policies, our commitment is to promote community empowerment and cultivate open and collaborative dialogue with local communities and the various stakeholders involved.

Initially, we identified a lack of listening and dialogue with the community. We developed a plan to implement an effective social action strategy with positive impacts for all stakeholders.

In 2023 we carried out the following steps and activities in strategic territories:

- Cubatão (SP) Communities impacted: Vila Esperança, Vila Natal and Costa Muniz;
- São Vicente (SP) Impacted communities: Vale Novo, Acaraú and Parantinga;
- Beginning of the involvement and engagement of public authorities and other actors; and
- **Development of** specific socio-territorial development **projects**.



COLLABORATION OF STRATEGIC PARTNERS

In this initial phase, we mobilized a multidisciplinary team within the Company and relied on several strategic partners to gain a deep understanding of the community. Active listening was essential to understanding local vulnerabilities and aspirations.

Strategic partners played a pivotal role in the development of socio-territorial diagnoses within the communities. These diagnoses will guide future actions, enabling us to achieve our aspirations for the territory.

Empowerment: Enabling communities to take ownership of their own development.

Collaboration: Integrating different stakeholders to promote territorial development.

Sustainability: Pursuing economic, social, and environmental development in harmony with Rumo's values.

Social Transformation, Legal Assistance and Conflict Resolution: Promote significant changes, comply with legal aspects and address possible conflicts in a constructive way.

We acknowledge that only through the collaboration of local stakeholders can we ensure the effectiveness and sustainability of our initiatives.

In order to guide our actions and projects implemented in Baixada Santista, we adopt the Social Impact Mandala methodology, developed by Gerando Falcões. This methodology allows us to understand the identity of communities and effectively direct our social action strategy. Guided by a multifaceted approach, we strive to address the genuine needs of the community, nurturing development and fostering a positive impact within these territories.

Projects developed using this methodology are implemented on several fronts:

- Social Urbanism and Decent Housing;
- Access to Health;
- Citizenship and culture of peace;
- Right to education;
- Early Childhood;
- Sports and Leisure Culture;
- Environment; and
- Income generation.

These fronts allow us to address local challenges in a comprehensive and effective way, aiming to improve the quality of life and strengthen communities in Baixada Santista.

The primary communities impacted by the projects' Social Actions were Vila Esperança, Vale Novo, Paratinga, Costa Muniz, Acaraú, and Vila Natal, which were defined as Priority Communities for Rumo in Cubatão (SP) and São Vicente (SP).

CHALLENGES IN BAIXADA SANTISTA

In early 2023, we suffered from an increase in acts of vandalism against trains in the Baixada Santista region. These incidents had a direct negative impact on the efficiency of trains heading to the Port of Santos, harming not only railway operations but also the surrounding communities.


To address this situation, our immediate response was focused on interventions and maintenance along the roadway, aiming to restore adequate safety conditions and compliance with environmental regulations. Additionally, we established partnerships with public authorities, using technological structures dedicated to managing the issue.

We acknowledge the context of inequality in the country, which has been exacerbated in recent years by the COVID-19 crisis, placing public safety as a crucial issue in Brazil. Cargo theft, while not unique to the country, is a common occurrence on a large scale, negatively impacting businesses, the environment, and local communities.

We understand that ensuring safety is a fundamental responsibility of the State. However, as an active company operating in these regions, we recognize our role and take on this responsibility.

Therefore, we strive to understand the underlying causes of crime, recognizing it as a social and public issue, often linked to a lack of opportunities, employment, housing, and quality education.

The aforementioned events led us to reevaluate Rumo's social responsibility strategy in the Baixada Santista communities. All the initiatives presented in this chapter reflect the beginning of our journey to transform the communities surrounding the railway operations in this location.





POSITIVE IMPACT ON SOCIETY







Founded in 2021, Instituto Rumo implements projects to promote novel future prospects and positive transformations in the lives of youth in the municipalities where Rumo is present.

Through the Institute, we are expanding training and opportunities for young people aged 15 to 24, encouraging leadership, with actions in railway safety, education, culture and sport.

We generate shared value and proximity to communities by promoting the socioproductive inclusion and professional development of young people.



STREET SOCCER FOR EDUCATION

By supporting sports activities, Instituto Rumo promotes the development of socio-emotional skills, citizenship, and transformation in the lives of children and adolescents in the territories where it operates.

The "Futebol de Rua" (Street Soccer) Project fosters the sporting inclusion of children and adolescents between the ages of 8 and 15, living in situations of social vulnerability and low-income communities. It aims to contribute to the improvement of learning conditions, citizenship, and the development of values.

The activities are developed through the lens of citizenship education, guided by sports practices. In this approach, soccer is used as a tool for social transformation, engagement, and social protagonism.

Weekly after-school meetings are held for beneficiaries, with workshops on human development, sports, and academic support.

In late 2023, we commenced the implementation of Street Soccer for Education in the Malha Sul, in the city of São Francisco do Sul (SC). This involved conducting an inaugural class and a regional diagnostic assessment.



We promote social engagement and volunteering, supporting public schools in overcoming their challenges for the promotion of quality education.

The "Adopt a School" project enables educational actions in the municipality of Cubatão (SP), offering support and volunteer labor to public schools in the city.

Through the project, we have strengthened our ties with the school community and fostered the overcoming of educational challenges in the face of Brazil's socioeconomic inequality, which has been exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic.

TREM DO BEM VOLUNTEER PROGRAM

Since 2017, we have had the "Trem do Bem" (Train of Goodness) volunteer program, which aims to encourage employees to carry out activities in institutions that help socially vulnerable people, in the communities near our units and in all the municipalities where our railway lines pass through.

In 2023, the "Trem do Bem" program supported 26 projects through direct financial support, with an investment of R\$232 thousand in these actions.

The committee responsible for selecting supported projects is made of senior leadership from various areas of Rumo. The committee evaluates and selects projects based on criteria of vulnerability, impact, financial resources, institution, return, and type of action.

Among the projects chosen are educational, cultural and health initiatives, covering schools, hospitals, associations, NGOs and institutions that serve children, young people, adults, the elderly, people with disabilities, the environment, and other causes.

We support one of the largest public schools in the city, fostering a positive image of the railway among the community through dialogue and playful activities.


In April 2023, inspired by the Easter theme, we promoted actions of the Trem do Bem at a municipal school in the city of Ponta Grossa (PR).

The Institution is one of the largest schools in the city and faces challenges in meeting the needs of all children on special dates.

Located in a region with numerous housing complexes, bordering the railway line, a significant portion of the students live in social vulnerability situations.

The territory features an unauthorized Level Crossing (PN) used by residents and students to commute to school.

Given this vulnerable situation, we organized a special event to educate children about the importance of the railway for the city, focusing on the dissemination of this message to their families and other community groups.

Activities implemented:

- Chat with children and teachers about the railway and its relationship with the community; and
- Distribution of chocolates to all students.

PRIVATE SOCIAL INVESTMENT

Our private social investment actions are based on Rumo's Private Social Investment Policy. This policy establishes strategies, guidelines, and actions for the application of the Company's financial, human, and material resources.

In 2023, we donated to 34 institutions, with a direct investment of R\$ 3.9 million, in donation services aligned with Rumo's Social Investment Policy.

Through private social investment, we generate positive social impact in the municipalities where we are present.

Furthermore, with a focus on leverage our initiatives, we actively participate in the Group of Institutes, Foundations and Companies (GIFE), a platform with over 160 members, whose work aims to strengthen philanthropy and private social investment in Brazil.


INCENTIVE LAWS

"CORAÇÃO DE MÃE" (MOTHER'S HEART) - RIO VERDE (GO)

Our actions to enhance access to good living and health for the elderly attest to Rumo's commitment to a fairer and more participatory society.

The Coração de Mãe project aims to increase the number of beneficiaries at the Long-Term Institution for the Elderly (ILPI), in the city of Rio Verde (GO).

To this end, throughout 2023 we invested in structures to provide improved care, basic and essential services for our elderly residents.

MALHA PAULISTA

PEQUENOS GRANDES LEITORES

We encourage children's reading to support the development of future citizens, with the ability to critically read the world and transform their realities. The "Pequenos Grandes Leitores" (Little Big Readers) project has implemented children's libraries, with playful elements for learning and space for fun and sensory educational activities.

The facilities were designed to stimulate the cognitive and social development of children in schools, hospitals, or daycare centers.

The inaugurations took place in October, in celebration of Children's Month.

LARGE-SCALE IMPACT

The project provides training in multifunctional pedagogy for educators responsible for children during its implementation.

We promote the training of educators to effectively implement reading mediation practices.

In this manner, trained professionals use the materials available in libraries in a proper manner, ensuring the development of skills in children.

RUMO AO NATAL

The The "Rumo ao Natal" (Journey Towards Christmas) initiative brought the enchantment of Christmas lights to over 40 municipalities in the states of São Paulo, Paraná, and Santa Catarina.

During the month of December 2023, Rumo's Christmas Train, adorned with 3 thousand meters of LED ribbon, traveled through various locations, bringing culture, leisure, and well-being to the residents of the regions it passed through.

In partnership with the Ministry of Culture – through the Culture Incentive Law (Rouanet Law) – the Brazilian Association of Railroad Preservation (ABPF), Instituto Acerte, the São Paulo Metropolitan Train Company (CPTM) and MRS Logística, cities in the Interior and Coast of the Malha Paulista and municipalities in Malha Sul received the Christmas Train.

In Malha Paulista, the Rumo ao Natal action covered 800km, passing through the cities of the interior and coast of São Paulo.

On Malha Sul, Christmas trains traveled through 21 municipalities in Paraná and Santa Catarina. The route was made aboard a special steam locomotive, the only one of its kind in operation in South America.

COMMUNITY SAFETY



COMMUNITY SAFETY

Guided by the principle "United for safety," which is embedded in Rumo's DNA, we have implemented a series of initiatives aimed at enhancing the safety of the communities surrounding our operations.

Through our Strategic Safety Plan (SSP), we have organized a community-focused action front with the aim of reducing accidents.

Within this context, we promote public awareness, establish partnerships with key stakeholders such as the Department of Motor Vehicles (Detran) and municipalities, demarcate right-of-way lans, and build grade-separated crossings in areas prone to urban conflicts.

Our social actions in this sense implement Environmental Education and Communication Programs so that our relationships keep up with the demands of operations (learn more about the programs structure in the Community Relationship chapter, page 15).



HIGHLIGHTS OF SOCIAL ACTIONS FOR SAFETY

Throughout 2023, we implemented a series of actions across Malha Paulista, Malha Central, and LRV to promote responsible traffic behavior, encourage proper use of pedestrian walkways, host lectures addressing common railway-related queries, disseminate information about improvement projects, provide instructions on safety within the railway right-of-way and operational procedures, and more.

COMMUNICATION, ENGAGEMENT AND SAFETY AT MALHA PAULISTA

In August 2023, a visit was conducted to the city of Cubatão (SP) for the purpose of implementing initiatives focused on community safety.

The purpose of the visit was to assess the feasibility of Social Communication actions among the neighboring population in the area where Rumo will be implementing the construction work of a Pedestrian Walkway over the railway.

Through our relationship channels, we have been made aware of the community's concerns regarding the insecurity situation in the region, demanding measures to address the violence at the existing pedestrian level crossing (LC), in addition to complaints about cracks in their homes caused by vibrations.

We contacted Quimassa, the contractor in charge, and requested precautionary reports regarding this situation. We also delivered pamphlets and spoke to local residents, both to disseminate our communication channels and to clarify our actions aimed at improving the daily lives of the surrounding population.

We recognize that proximity and partnerships are powerful tools for optimizing our relationship with communities. Our periodic visits expedite the resolution of potential adversities, enhancing trust in the Company.

YELLOW MAY CAMPAIGN

We publicize our railway safety pills internally and on our social networks, which address the most relevant topics for operational safety, and which must be disseminated to communities.

The safety of our employees, partners and suppliers always comes first. During the month of May, we support the Yellow May initiative, which aims to promote awareness about traffic safety in an informative and interactive way.

Users benefited from publications on traffic safety. With this action, we emphasize the importance of care during level changes to ensure a safe crossing, in order to prevent incidents.







COMMUNITY SAFETY STRATEGIC PLAN

All occurrences and incidents around the railways are recorded and treated in an integrated management system, and are subsequently monitored by the Company's Operational Committee.

Additionally, the Operational Safety area is responsible for managing the Strategic Safety Plan (SSP).

The SSP is divided into nine action fronts (blocks), one of which is specifically aimed at the Community, aiming to reduce collisions and run-over accidents.

To this end, we develop actions aimed a traising awareness among the population, establishing relationships and partnerships with relevant stakeholders, such as Detran, to seal right-of-way and build grade-separated crossings in areas prone to urban conflicts.



WALKWAYS

In 2023, we enhanced the safety and accessibility of the pedestrian crossing between Santos (SP) and Guarujá (SP)

To ensure the safety of people and improve circulation on the right bank, we inaugurated the Customs Walkway at the Port of Santos (SP) with 54 meters wide, 7.1 meters high and elevators with capacity for 16 people, with an estimate to serve 20 thousand people per day.

The project was made possible through a partnership between the Santos City Hall, Santos Port Authority (SPA), and Rumo.

CULTURAL RESPONSIBILITY - HERITAGE PRESERVATION

The construction of the walkway was part of the urban planning project developed by the Santos City Hall (SP) for the revitalization and preservation of the city's Central Region.

The architectural design of the project was created in harmony with the Customs House building, erected in the 19th century and currently listed as a historical heritage site of the Municipality.

Rumo's social activities are in line with the knowledge of its role in society and the importance of preserving collective memory in the locations where it operates. With this project, the Company has positively impacted the city's economic development, infrastructure improvement, and the preservation and enhancement of local culture.

The entire construction was carried out in compliance with legal procedures and with the approval of the relevant historical heritage protection agencies. Furthermore, the implementation of the walkway was approved by the Santos City Council for the Protection of Cultural Heritage (Condepasa).

FUTURE


For the coming year, we will continue to implement actions to promote sustainable development and ensure the safety of people in our surroundings.


